


FCI SHAR PEI STANDARD

- **Brevity**
- Missing deeper explanation of important feature of the breed
- Missing explanation of the full range of varieties of each part of the body Imperfections make confusion, chaos and self-explanation

THE MOST FAMOUS SHAR PEI MYTHS

- The standard says: Only 3 wrinkles on the withers are allowed
- Right shar pei is only HC coat
- HC = trady shar pei
- Only bone moth is trady type
- How to divide a coat: HC is soft, BC is sharp
- Trady type has no chance to achieve positive description at the dog shows
- Wash your dog as often as possible
- All S/S dogs are sick
- > BC are more primitive (simple nature)...

AKC



- Differences in a head, skull and mouth description
- Limited range of the colors
- Body -Very strong and straight back
- Size (19-23ins) 48-58cm
- Short-brief. Other very similar to FCI (excluding head shape)

- The only standard with very brief HC and BC classification (not as a definition of the terms, just as an explanation)
- Very similar to FCI, but an explanation of each part is more detailed.

ONE STANDARD EVERYWHERE

HKSt

COAT

Short, hard, bristly and as straight as possible. No undercoat. Length must not be over 2.5cm (1 inch) long. Never trimmed.

AKQ

Coat: The extremely harsh coat is one of the distinguishing features of the breed. The coat is absolutely straight and off standing on the main trunk of the body but generally lies somewhat flatter on the limbs. The coat appears healthy without being shiny or lustrous. Acceptable coat lengths may range from extremely short "horse coat" up to the "brush coat," not to exceed 1 inch in length at the withers. A soft coat, a wavy coat, a coat in excess of one inch at the withers or a coat that has been trimmed is a major fault. The Shar-Pei is shown in its natural state.

FCI St

COAT

A distinctive feature of the breed: short, harsh and bristly. The coat is straight and offstanding on the body, but generally flatter on the limbs. No undercoat. The coat may vary in length from 1 cm to 2,5 cm. Never trimmed.

AS FIRST... TYPE

Type is not about lenght of the coat (let stop to use terms HC:BC)

- Meat mouth : bone mouth
- Modern type : Trady type

Both type should meet the requirements of the

OFICIAL standard

-size, coat, front, angulation, enought strong bones,


GENERAL APPEARANCE


GENERAL APPEARANCE : Active, <u>compact</u>, short coupled and <u>squarely built</u> dog of medium size.


The height of the Shar Pei from withers to ground is approximately equal to the length of the body, from point of shoulder to point of buttock, especially in males.

Dogs larger and more powerful than bitches.

Height: 44 - 51 cm at withers (17,5 - 20 ins)








TOP LINE - SILHOUETTE

Dips slightly behind withers; then it rises slightly over loin.







HORNÁ LÍNIA



Short forelegs and straight angulation

HEAD - SKULL

The head is rather large in proportion to body. The length from nose to stop is approximately equal to the length from stop to occiput.



MUZZLE

Muzzle: A distinctive feature of the breed. Broad from root to tip of nose with no suggestion of tapering. Lips and top of muzzle well padded. Bulge at the base of the nose permissible. Lower lip not rolled in, NOT interfering with the bite.



MUZZLE

- Lower lip rolled in, interfering with the bite.
- Skin, folds or hair disturbing the normal function of the eye.
- Tapering luzzle
- Very heavy and free lips











MOUTH AND TOUGUE

Tongue, roof of mouth, gums and flews: bluish black is preferred. Pink spotted ongue permissible. Solid pink tongue highly undesirable.













In dilute-coloured dogs the tongue is solid lavender.

Black colored dogs – the tongue and gums should be completle dark.


MOUTH AND TOUGUE





Spotted tongue
(except pink spotted tongue).
Solid pink tongue.
Black colored dog should have complet dark pigmentation.







JAWS/TEETH

Jaws strong with a perfect scissor bite.

The upper teeth closely overlapping the lower teeth and set square to the jaws. – **scissor bite**

Padding of lower lip should not be so excessive as to interfere with the bite.





Carnassial teeth must be out of the gum










The correct bite is a matter of the shape of the head and welfare

JAWS/TEETH



qualification - Deviation from a scissor bite (as a transitory measure, a very slightly rshot mouth is permissible)...match.





Dark, almond-shaped with a scowling expression. Lighter colour permissible in dilute-coloured dogs.

Function of eyeball or lid in no way disturbed by surrounding skin, folds or hair

EYES









- Any sign of irritation of eyeball is highly undesirable.
- Round, bulging eye. Entropion, ectropion.
- Skin, folds or hair disturbing the normal function of the eyes



Light color of the eyes in black colored dogs is not preferable

EYES









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EARS

Very small, rather thick, equilaterally triangular in shape, slightly rounded at tip and set high on the skull with tips pointing towards eyes; set well forward over eyes, wide apart and close to skull.










Pricked ears-disqalif

High set, not correct pointing, not enough close to the skull

WRINKLES



Sentence about 3 wrinkles on the body don't exist in the standard.

It is the most common myth and a mistake

Wrinkles on forehead and cheeks continuing to form dewlap.

Wrinkles over skull and withers

Folds of skin on body in mature dogs highly undesirable except on withers and base of tail, moderate wrinkling.

Wrinkles are a typical feature of the Shar Pei breed. Logically, share pei must have more of them in a "healthy measure" than in other breeds!

HEAD+DEWLOP+MAGIC TRIANGLE





All wrinkles inside of the triangle Neck-elbow-root of the teil Are correct

- + on the head
- + appropriate dewlap

Wrinkles are a typical feature of the Shar Pei breed. Logically, share pei must have more of them in a "healthy measure" than in other breeds!










4 MOTHS: 2 YEARS



CHEST AND FORECHEAST







Chest: Broad and deep, brisket reaching the elbow.

Underline: Rises slightly under the loin.

Not very robust but appropriate a forechest

FRONT A AND FORECHEST


Forelegs straight, moderate length, good bone. The skin on forelegs shows no wrinkle..












TEIL

Lack of or incomplete tail highly undesirable - disqualif Low set tail



TEIL NEVER COVERS THE ANUS



COAT



A distinctive feature of the breed. Never trimmed.

You should consider 5 aspects of the shar pei's coat:

- Texture Sharpness!
- No undercoat
- Not glossy (matte)
- As short as possible max 2,5 cm
- straight and off standing on the body and withers, flatter on the limbs

Check sharpness hair. You must feel the tingling in your hand

Stop use a terms HC and BC





Not longer than 2,5 cm

COAT

Trimmed, undercoat, soft, silky, curly, bright



NAJČASTEJŠIE FARBY







All solid colours acceptable except white. Tail and rear part of thighs frequently of a lighter colour. Darker shading down the back and on the ears permissible.











SABLE






Very important color in breeding - adds pigment to the tongue, mucous, and claws

CORRECT CHEST AND ANGULATION IMPACT ON THE HEALTH





Very narrow front, not enough space for heart, not good mechanics of the movement in front. Not enough arched chest - no space for correct position of the internal organs

POHYB



The gait is free, balanced, active with good forward reach and strong drive from the hindquarters. The feet tend to converge to a center line when the speed increases. Stilted gait undesirable.





The angulation of the limbs is very important for correct movement. With insufficient angulation of the back limbs, not correct arm, and with not enough angulation of heels, the movement is with a short step and with lack of power.

HINDQUARTERS



Muscular, strong, moderately angulated, perpendicular to the ground and parallel to each other when viewed from the rear.

Hocks: Well let down...










HINDQUARTERS

50%-60% dogs at the shows



Sheer, not enough angulated heels

FOREQUARTERS




Forelegs straight, moderate length, good bone.

Good set elbow

Shoulders: Muscular, well laid and sloping. Pastern: Slightly sloping,

strong and flexible.









FOREQUARTERS





70% of shar pei at the shows have a serious fault in forelimbs Short straight arms bones and shoulder

CONCLUSION

- Responsible breeder make a breeding plan base on deep knowledge
- We have 2 basic varieties of the breed
- We should establish (or find again?) humility and respect to each other
- Feedback (negative too) can shift you ahead
- Learn how to recognize the faults of your dogs and use this knowledge as a positive, which can help you the go-ahead
- Every breed is in the continual process of evolution. All of us make small or bigger steps to improve or destruct it. (What we can be? Improvers or destructors?)
- Base on our choices we become positive or negative personalities in process of evolution..
